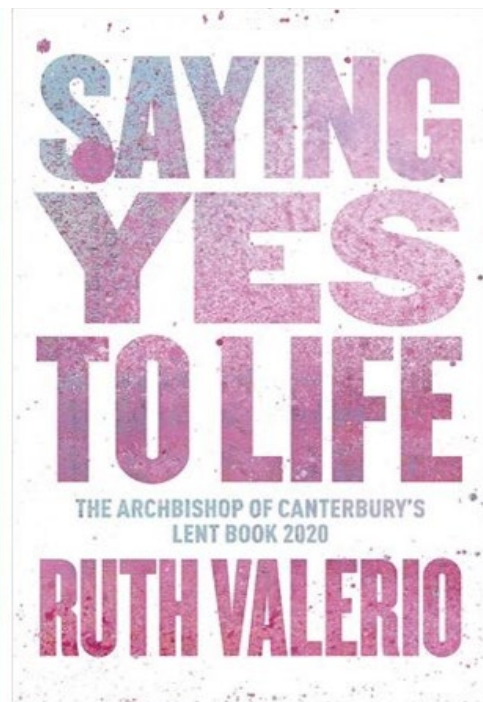
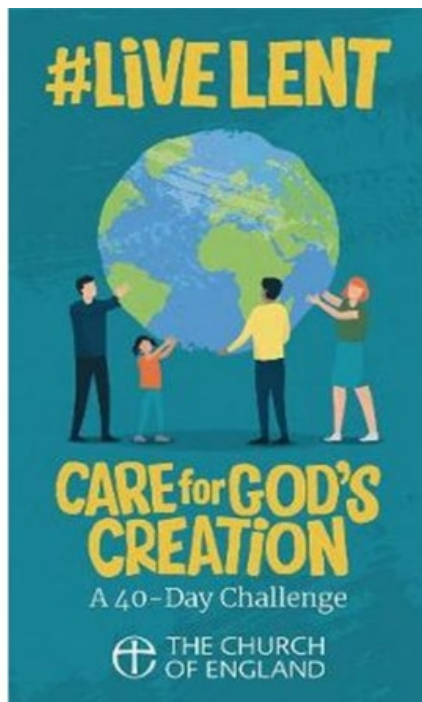
SPOTLIGHT ON

RESOURCES FOR RESPONSE TO CLIMATE EMERGENCY

The issue of climate change and our
response as churches and as followers of
Christ is now a high priority. Below are a
number of resources you may find useful
as you prepare for the keeping of Lent or
at another time of year.

SAYING YES TO LIFE

This year's Archbishop of Canterbury
Lent Book is 'Saying Yes To Life' by Ruth
Valerio. He writes in the forward that this
book is perfect for individuals and groups
to think, reflect, pray and be challenged
together. As people made in the image
of God, we are entrusted to look after
what he has created: to share in God's joy
and ingenuity in making a difference for
good. Ruth Valerio imaginatively draws
on the Days of Creation (Genesis 1) as she
relates themes of light, water, land, the
seasons, other creatures, humankind,
Sabbath rest and resurrection hope
to matters of environmental, ethical

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SPOTLIGHT ON HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY

The 75th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau will be marked on January 27, 2020.

This significant milestone is made particularly poignant by the declining number of survivors who are able to share their testimony.

The Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby, the Chief Rabbi Ephraim Mirvis and Senior Imam Qari Asim have united to write a new prayer for Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) 2020.

The prayer, which the faith leaders developed in partnership with Holocaust Memorial Day Trust, can be used by people of any faith at activities marking the day.

The prayer highlights the theme of HMD 2020, Stand Together, which encourages communities to stand together to stop division and prevent the spread of hate in society. The theme recognises that genocidal regimes throughout history have deliberately fractured societies by marginalising certain groups.

The prayer reminds us of the horrors of history when prejudices

have driven people apart, and calls on people of all faiths and none to stand together to support those who are suffering today.

THE PRAYER

Loving God, we come to you with heavy hearts, remembering the six million Jewish souls murdered during the Holocaust.

In the horrors of that history, when so many groups were targeted because of their identity, and in genocides which followed, we recognise destructive prejudices that drive people apart.

Forgive us when we give space to fear, negativity and hatred of others, simply because they are different from us.

In the light of God, we see everyone as equally precious manifestations of the Divine, and can know the courage to face the darkness.

Through our prayers and actions, help us to stand together with those who are suffering, so that light may banish all darkness, love will prevail over hate and good will triumph over evil.

HEARTEDGE IN PENZANCE

HeartEdge supports churches in blending their mission around four key areas:

- Congregation: Inclusive approaches to liturgy, worship and day-to-day communal life;
- Compassion: models of outreach serving local need and addressing social justice;
- Culture: art, music and ideas to re-imagine the Christian narrative for the present moment;
- Commerce: Commercial activities that generate finance, creatively extending and enhancing mission and ministry through social enterprise.

BISHOP ISSUES UNITY PLEA

The Bishop of Truro, the Rt Revd Philip Mounstephen, has issued a plea for unity this Christmas.

"Unity is a very fitting theme for Christmas. One of our Anglican prayers often used at Midnight Mass says: 'On this holy night, Heaven is come down to Earth and Earth is raised to Heaven.' The birth of Jesus, who is both God and man, creates a touching place where heaven and earth meet, in unity. And in Jesus, God invites us to enter into a relationship, into union, with him. But we can't stop there. God steps towards us in the baby of Bethlehem to draw us into union with him. And that also puts the onus on us to step towards others, and into unity with them."
