Leading Cornish voices, drawn from business, community, faith and charity sectors, have set out their vision of a 'Fair and Just Future for Cornwall' in a report that will be presented to council leaders and the Cornwall's MPs.



The report features contributions from 21 different organisations including Anne Thomas, CEO of Cornwall Care, Ann Vandermeulen from Cornwall Federation of Small Businesses, Manda Brookman from Extinction Rebellion, Wailim Wong from Cornwall Citizens Advice, Allister

Young from Coastline Housing and Jane Yeomans from Transformation Cornwall. The Rt Revd Philip Mounstephen, Bishop of Truro and report contributor, said: "Whilst not everyone will agree with its conclusions, we are

keen that this report enables a wider public conversation about Cornwall and what its future might look like. I salute all the contributors for their deep commitment to Cornwall and its people.

How can we as a church be aware of the needs of such workers, accept them as part of our communities and extend a real welcome, just as if they were from Newcastle or Totnes?

There will be a zoom session on Thursday, July 23 from 9.30am to 11.30am which will offer an opportunity to hear first-hand from people who have had this experience.

Their story contains both good and worrying elements.

Ten years ago the Diocese of Truro partnered with Bridging Arts to run a successful project to support churches seeking to respond to migrant workers. ## END HUNGER CORNWALL CAMPAIGN GATHERS SPEED

The Diocese of Truro, Cornwall Independent Poverty Forum and End Hunger UK are leading the End Hunger Cornwall campaign to do more, in Cornwall. The campaign is gaining momentum, and everyone is invited to join in.

Organisers say: "While it is a great thing that footballer Marcus Rashford has managed to use his celebrity influence to get the long-standing holiday school meals campaign over the line, we should be very aware that without his intervention the government would have quietly and happily let 1,300,000 children go hungry all summer without batting an eyelid.

"Notwithstanding the millions of others who go hungry every day as a matter of course it shows the scale of the challenge and the desperate need for continued, persistent campaigning.

"This isn't getting better. Food banks are NOT normal. Many people of all generations go hungry in Cornwall every day and it simply isn't acceptable."

## NEW REALITY, SAME MISSION RESOURCE

A new URC resource has been launched to help people explore how they can respond to the current needs, opportunities and injustices in their local neighbourhoods.

It is hoped that *New reality, same mission* will act as a stimulus to renewed community engagement by individuals and local congregations as lockdown eases.

The resource is complementary to the acclaimed booklet produced last month by URC Synod Moderators, *Ready for the new "normal": a discussion paper for a pandemic recovery and resumption plan*, and uses questions in that paper as its starting-point. It was developed by members of the URC's Mission and Discipleship teams, working with several church related communityworkers and the director of Church Action on Poverty.

### FUNDING LIST

Transformation Cornwall has developed a **funding list** to support food banks, grassroots organisations and faith based social action projects in Cornwall needing support.

### FOYLE FOUNDATION

The **Foyle Foundation Small Grants Scheme** has re-opened for new applications.

Charities are now operating within very different circumstances since the March 2020 COVID-19 lockdown. The foundation is keen to be as flexible as it can be in support of small charities during this difficult and constantly changing period, while maintaining a focus on those who can demonstrate a clear (usually local) need for their services and financial viability over the 12 months from the date of their application.

The foundation's focus will be to make one-year grants only to cover core costs or essential equipment, to enable ongoing service provision, homeworking, or delivery of online digital services to charities that can show financial stability.

Its priority will be to support local charities still active in their communities which are currently delivering services to the young, vulnerable, elderly, disadvantaged or the general community either directly or through online support.

Online Applications can be received at all times, but it may take up to three months to obtain a decision from trustees.

### £1,000 GRANTS

The Green & Lilian FM Ainsworth & Family benevolent fund provides grants up to £1,000 for UK charitable organisations providing social welfare activities in the UK.

## RELIEVING HUMAN SUFFERING SUPPORT GRANTS

One off grants of between £1,000 and £3,000 are available from the Souter Charitable Trust.

The trust supports UK registered charities working to help relieve human suffering in the UK and overseas, particularly projects with a Christian emphasis.

The next application deadline is **Friday, August 21, 2020.**

Applications should be made in writing

on no more than two sides of A4. The trust will expect a brief outline of the project aims and what the funding is required for. A budget should be included, together with a copy of the applicant's latest audited accounts.

## UP TO £2,500 AVAILABLE TO SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS

Grants between £125 and £2,500 for UK registered charities and community and voluntary groups to support small-scale projects with a community emphasis that are finding it hard to obtain funding from elsewhere are available from the Wakeham Trust.

The trust will consider the following when deciding which applications to support:

- Is it something new for this particular area? Is it small?
- Will it find it hard to get support elsewhere?

- Is it run by ordinary people, not professionals?
- Does it have the potential to become self-supporting?
- Is it outward looking, rather than being focused on its own members?

The trust does not have an application form. Applications may be submitted at any time, ideally by email. Further information, including details of the application process, is available on the **Wakeham Trust's website.**

## STOP LOAN SHARKS COMMUNITY FUND GRANTS

Grants up to £5,000 for not-for-profit organisations across England for projects that aim to raise awareness of - and prevent - illegal money lending are available from the Stop Loan Sharks Community Fund.

The deadline for applications is midnight on Monday, August 31, 2020. Local charities, community groups, voluntary organisations, schools, statutory agencies and local residents in England are all eligible to apply. ## PROJECT WORKER JOB VACANCY

Transformation Cornwall is seeking to recruit an experienced Project Worker for its work with faith based social action projects across Cornwall.

# FIRST TREES PLANTED AS FOREST FOR CORNWALL PROJECT GROWS

The 'Forest for Cornwall' was kick-started last month with the first 105 trees of the programme being planted in Saltash. The project is part of the council's bigger Climate Change Plan and has been made a priority following research which put the planting of new trees in the top three actions requested by the public.

The project will create new woodlands and copses and will plant trees in Cornwall's countryside and towns, it

will increase hedgerows and what is called 'canopy cover'.

### SAYING YES TO LIFE

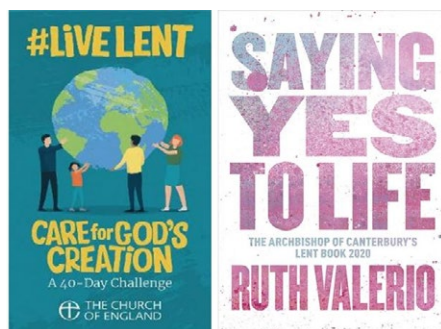
This year's Archbishop of Canterbury Lent Book is *Saying Yes To Life* by Ruth Valerio.

## CHRISTIANITY & CREATION: GREEN DISCIPLESHIP FOR CORNWALL

The detrimental effects of human activity on the natural world have been well-known for many years, but during 2019 they rose dramatically up the public consciousness, due at least in part to demonstrations led by groups such as Extinction Rebellion and the involvement of young people all over the world.

For Christians, the natural world which we have the privilege to inhabit is created by God, for us both to enjoy and to care for, but that understanding brings with it significant challenges to our discipleship.

In Cornwall, work has been going on for some years through the Diocese of Truro to help both individual Christians and their churches to live more gently on the earth, and to equip them to take a lead in their communities on caring for creation.

The Christianity & Creation: Green Discipleship for Cornwall four-week course is designed to help Christian groups think through the environmental crisis facing us today from a Christian perspective and to begin to make some decisions about the changes to all our lifestyles that so urgently need to be made. The course can be used over any four or five week period, but it is offered here particularly for use in Lent 2020, following the Archbishop of Canterbury's encouragement to the whole Church of England to make caring for God's creation a focus of our Lent reflections in 2020.
