CALLED TO FLY, FLOAT & FALL

On Saturday afternoons, if I can, I go for a walk from my house in Penzance, around Mounts Bay. The Bay always like a postcard with St Michael's Mount in the background, the sea always different, the light and colours ever changing, the wind usually blowing.

Sometimes the sea is full of people - those who feel compelled, called, to put on wetsuits, stand on pieces of board and variously attach sails to themselves. The speedy wind-surfers, the acrobatic kite surfers and the crazy sail surfers, tenuously attached to both a tiny board (with hydrofoil) and a small sail in their hands. All surfing the sea, riding waves and wind. Bold and not afraid to fall and they fall often. FOUNDATIONS IN CHRISTIAN MINISTRY AND SENS KERNEWEK

The next Foundations in Christian

Ministry course will run from September 2022 to June 2023.

This one-year parttime programme of formational study will provide space for people to explore their vocation and grow in Christ. Participants will learn about the Bible, theology, spirituality, pastoral care and mission. They'll enjoy the fellowship of other Christians at the Saturday Study Days and will share in worship and hospitality.

We are also taking applications for our next Sens Kernewek cohort that will begin in January 2023. Meetings take place once a fortnight on week night evenings. This six-month programme focuses on learning scripturally and theologically from our lived experience, sharing together in Bible study and prayer. Participants may attend both the

Encouraging others to explore their vocation

Pastoral Ministry

All who would follow Christ are called to love our neighbours but God also calls some, through their gifts of inspired listening and understanding, to public ministries of care.

The Diocese of Truro recognises that individuals may be called to exercise just such a public ministry by visiting those in need, as well as offering other ministries of care and welcome such as administering home communion, baptism or marriage preparation and bereavement support.

We offer a training course **Key Skills** in **Pastoral Care** that covers the core skills needed in Christian pastoral work, those of: listening to others, understanding our own feelings and needs, reflecting on the Christian significance of what we are doing, working in a team and understanding confidentiality.

In addition we offer ongoing support, training and advice to all LPMs and Pastoral Teams.

Worship Leading

Some individuals may be gifted in leading others in worship. Local Worship Leaders (LWL) may be authorised to assist at a Eucharistic or other services led by ordained or licensed ministers; they may devise and lead Services of the Word (BCP or Common Worship), special services, new forms of worship such as Café or Messy Church, under the authority, scrutiny and guidance of their incumbent. They are not licensed to preach.

We offer the **Sunday Plus training** course which is designed to train Local Worship Leaders to lead worship, not

just on Sundays, but at anytime, covering subjects such as service structure, the church year, using technology, all age worship, learning styles and prayer. There is also an ongoing package of training and support available.

Financial Planning During your Ministry and Beyond

The aim of this seminar is to help clergy (and their partners) demystify financial matters, and to help you plan for your financial future no matter how far you may be from retirement.

The speakers will address personal financial planning issues and questions that in their experience face most clergy.

Key themes for the day:

- What to expect from the clergy pension scheme and considering the options for saving more
