There will be four roadshows taking place between **3pm** and **5pm** in:


Launceston (May 8), Bodmin (May 15), Truro (May 22), Camborne (May 29).

Each will include many of the usual components of a church service but in a slightly different way, aimed at helping people of all ages connect with God and one another, all while enjoying afternoon tea together.

Bishop Philip will be joining each one and we hope that each will model one approach to an intergenerational church gathering and inspire people to have a go at it in their own context. The events will also provide resources for people to run their own version of the event in their own church.

Archdeacon Kelly Betteridge, who leads on Intergenerational Church in the diocese, said: "We want people to enjoy the roadshows and feel inspired. Intergenerational church isn't about getting children in church or messy activities.

"The roadshows will be a time to come together, build relationships, learn about intergenerational church, worship and enjoy afternoon tea!"

In these turbulent times, Easter in Cornwall offered hope. Hope that Jesus can be our source of strength, comfort and peace. From Easter Explorations for primary schoolchildren, to sunrise services, fun days and camps.

Camborne celebrated with art and music reflections, prayer and Taize, Walks of Witness and a sunrise service at Beacon's recreation ground.

All Saints Highertown in Truro had a Christian Seder Meal on Maundy Thursday, a sunrise service at Porthtowan and an Easter sunrise prayer walk across Dudman Farm.

In Polruan, children and visitors alike enjoyed an action packed Easter Messy Church on the quay. After an Easter egg hunt and songs, there was a brief service before everyone tucked into more eggs and Hot Cross buns.

In St Austell, churches came together on Good Friday to enjoy music, crafts and re telling of the Easter story in the town square.







Two day training course

Tackling climate change is essential to the life of faith. It is a way to love our neighbour and to care for the gift of creation. In 2020, recognising that the global climate emergency is a crisis for God's creation, and a fundamental injustice, the General Synod of the Church of England set a bold target of reaching net zero carbon emissions by 2030. We hope this course will inspire and equip you to act to reach this target.

CAT's Zero Carbon Britain (ZCB) team have developed a two day training for the Church of England. The ZCB project offers the hard data and confidence required for visualising a future where we have risen to the demands of climate science. It helps to reduce fear and misunderstandings and open new, positive, solutions-focused conversations.

The most recent report published in 2019, Zero Carbon Britain: Rising to the Climate Emergency, incorporates the very latest developments in science and technology to show that we can create a zero carbon Britain using only proven technology.

On this bespoke course, you will explore all aspects of climate solutions and scenarios presented in the research. Live lectures will cover a range of topics from renewable energy and energy efficiency to diets and land-use, looking at how these can work together to help us build a zero carbon future. Online workshops will enable discussion and debate among participants on catalysing action across all areas of society.

Some of the topics covered include:

- How we can provide a reliable energy supply for the UK with 100% renewable energy sources and flexible carbon neutral back up – without fossil fuels, nuclear power, or gambling on the promise of future technology.
- How we can grow the vast majority of the food we need for a healthy, low carbon diet, and manage our land to capture carbon, nurture biodiversity and increase the health and resilience of our ecosystems.
- How we can deliver a modern lifestyle, create employment, improve our wellbeing, and
 ensure that the future we leave for our children and generations to come is safe and
 sustainable.
- Understanding key barriers to change, and how we can overcome them offering a range of other benefits in the process.
- Case studies from churches which have implemented zero carbon solutions.

This two day course will run on the Wednesday $18^{\rm th}$ and Thursday $19^{\rm th}$ May 2022, sessions run from 10am to 5pm each day

BISHOP HUGH SPEAKS OUT: GENDER BASED VIOLENCE

Of all the hundreds of shocking images to have come out of the horrors of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, it's the ones from the bombed maternity hospital in Mariupol that have most seared themselves onto my heart. The young, heavily pregnant woman with her polka dot pyjamas, desperately running down the bombed out stairs and then – thank God – photos of her with her new born baby shortly afterwards.

It is women who suffer most in war. They suffer most because civilians make up 70% of those caught up in violence, they suffer because the majority of refugees are women, they suffer at the hands of soldiers, they suffer because women always suffer when law and order breaks down.

And what we see in Ukraine, and South Sudan, in Afghanistan and the Yemen, and in all the other hidden conflicts around the world, is the extreme end of a spectrum of disadvantage, discrimination and violence experienced by women in every society – including ours.

Amongst the most shocking of the statistics that could be listed is this one: 1 in 3 women around the world experience physical or sexual violence.

That's why the Mothers' Union is so involved with and committed to the No more 1 in 3 campaign. And I stand with you in that, and I am committed to playing my role, as a man, as a husband and father of three girls, as a church leader and as a disciple of Jesus Christ, in that campaign and in speaking against gender inequality of any kind.

And it is men who need to take the lead in this – not in the way men so often take the lead, by taking over, but by acknowledging that the problem is largely ours. That it is men who perpetrate acts of violence against women, men who benefit from discrimination and that it's men who need to change.

And as we do so, we need to acknowledge – I need to acknowledge – that Christianity and the church have contributed to the inequality that we see around us. We know that the bible includes stories of violence against women, and that those stories have been used to tolerate, condone and even promote discrimination and worse.

ENERGY FOOTPRINT TOOLKIT NOW OPEN

Thanks to the commitment of its churches, the Diocese of Truro had the second highest number of responses in its Energy Footprint Tool results last year. The Energy Footprint Tool has now opened for churches to add their 2021 details.

This tool is an essential part of our shared journey to Net Zero 2030 and helps to create the base line data from which we can chart our national church progress.

Bishop Hugh said: "I want to thank every church community that took time to submit their details last year, especially with so much else going on. It shows how seriously we take both the challenge of the climate emergency and the call to cherish creation here in Cornwall. Knowing how much carbon we are emitting is a crucial first step, and I hope that more churches will take up the invitation and add their details this year."

The Energy Footprint Toolkit (EFT) was created to measure the carbon footprints of all in-scope buildings within the Church of England. This will enable the General Synod to monitor progress towards the target of net zero emissions by 2030.

Diocesan Environment Officer Ben Lillie said: "Our diocesan Environment strategy commits us to Cherish Creation, Cut carbon and Speak up. We have to understand our baseline carbon usage in order to know how to cut it. The Energy Footprint Tool enables us to do exactly this.

"Sharing this data is an act of 'Speaking Up', of joining in with our sisters and brothers throughout Christ's Church. I urge you to make Creation Care a priority in your church by 'Speaking Up' as a Creation Care Champion and registering for the Kernow Green Church Award. As your diocesan environment officer, I'm here to support you in these essential Creation Care steps."
