READER MINISTRY

Bishop Hugh writes...

Readers have a unique place in the Church of England. Established in 1866, theirs is one of the very few licensed lay ministries recognised in Canon Law, and they have an honoured place in the life of this and many other dioceses.

In this diocese there are nearly 100 Readers – who can also be called Licensed Lay Ministers – and they are an essential part of the life and ministry of many of our church communities.

Over the last year a group has been working to make sure that Reader ministry remains at the heart of the life of the church in Cornwall into the future. Alongside some practical changes, that has also meant being really clear about the particular role of Readers. That's important because, unlike in 1866, there are now lots of ways for people to take up a formal lay ministry – as well as Readers we have Local Worship Leaders, Pioneers, Chaplains and, increasingly, Local Ministers.

The description we have settled on is that Readers are community theologians who teach, preach and enable everyday faith. What we mean by that is that the church needs people who are called and equipped to help church communities to think and act as disciples, not just on Sundays, but from Monday to Saturday.



The word 'theologian' doesn't mean someone who has read lots of heavy and learned books, and who can tell you all about the detail of an obscure bible passage – it means someone who can talk about God, informed by 2,000 years of Christian wisdom and teaching, in ways that make sense for ordinary, everyday life.

Readers therefore go through a proper theological training, to enable them to be teachers, story tellers and interpreters, they are people who are deeply rooted in Scripture and spirituality and who are at home both in the church and in the world. Readers are communicators and connectors, who can help individuals and church communities grow in confident faith in their places of work, in their families and in their local communities. They are community theologians who teach, preach and enable everyday faith

We Readers/Licensed Lay ministers are a disparate bunch with almost as many ideas about what we do as Readers as there are Readers. We are working hard in the diocese to refine the role and underline Licensed Lay Ministry as a specific vocational choice alongside all the other lay and ordained ministries.

The training of Readers and indeed the administration of Readers is evolving and this year we have seen a number of changes. Following the retirement of Robin West, the administration of Readers is now being undertaken by Mel Pomery within the Ministry Team at Church House. We are very grateful to Robin for his hard work and wish him all the best for the future.

Also retiring this summer is our Director of Reader Training, Revd. Canon Jane Kneebone. Jane has been an incredible influence on the ministries of many Licensed Lay Ministers and we are hugely grateful for her contribution. Training will continue in partnership with SWMTC and we are currently recruiting for our new Licensed Ministry Officer and Tutor to join the diocesan ministry team.

The other corner of the triangle of support for Licensed Lay Ministers is chaplaincy which is moving to a new phase. Support of those in Ministry is of such importance that we need a team to do the job and to ensure there is always someone to talk to and to help.

TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Pastoral Ministry Training

There will be a selection of pastoral training courses running during June, July and beyond.

Key Skills introduction to pastoral ministry course. This will be on Thursday afternoons, runs for six weeks and is for those new to pastoral ministry.

Refresher Training. This two week course is for those who would like an opportunity to top up their listening skills and revisit some of their initial training. This course will also be helpful for those who administer communion at home.

End of Life Care. This two session course looks at how pastoral ministers can support those who are approaching their death. This will run on Tuesdays 5 & 12 July at 7.00pm on Zoom

Sunday Plus – Local Worship Leader Initial Training

This 8 session course aims to equip lay people with the skills and knowledge they need to confidently lead and create worship in their own context. During the course we will consider what is worship, structure, prayer, scripture, all age, music and more with plenty of time for discussion and sharing ideas.

Meeting together on Zoom allows us to bring together people from across the whole Diocese and usually means we have a range of styles and church traditions represented broadening the view of what worship is.

Local Worship Leaders should be supported by their PCC and will need to undertake safeguarding training to Leadership level.

CLERGY WELLBEING

Healthy Cornwall are offering free **NHS** health checks for people between 40 and 74 who have not had an NHS health check in the last five years. The health checks cover blood pressure, cholesterol, BMI, lifestyle screening (exercise, diet, smoking and alcohol) and risk projection for cardiovascular disease, stroke or heart attack.

We are able to offer these to clergy and will seek to run it at a location most convenient for those who express an interest.

Places of worship and associated faith community centres can apply for funding for a range of security measures.

This could include the installation of measures such as, CCTV cameras, security alarm systems and perimeter fencing to improve security protection at their site and help worshippers feel safer.
