16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM - GET INVOLVED

16 days of activism takes place internationally with the aim to raise awareness of gender-based violence. This year the focus is to raise awareness of domestic abuse, the various forms it comes in, and how we can respond.

16 Days of Activism takes place between November 25 and December 10, 2022.

While we need to be aware of domestic abuse year-round, events and awareness-raising during the 16 Days of Activism can keep the issue front of mind and start conversations around what can be done to tackle it.

The Church of England, along with many other charities and organisations, is taking an active role this year and will be rolling out a number of resources during the 16 days, which begins each year on International Day Against Violence Against Women (November 25) and falls directly after Safeguarding Sunday (November 20).

RESOURCES

A range of video resources including a call from the Bishop of Gloucester, Rachel Treweek, for more awareness about domestic abuse across all churches, will be available at the end of November.

Resources will be published on the Church of England **website**. They include a range of helpful and thought-provoking materials and will also provide some more detailed data on domestic abuse from diocesan self-assessments.

The diocese has been working in partnership with First Light, a charity that supports people who have been affected by domestic abuse and sexual violence, for a number of years. First Light have contributed one of
