DEVOLUTION DEAL FOR CORNWALL

It's a big deal for Cornwall

The Government and Cornwall Council have negotiated a proposed Devolution Deal. If it is accepted, Government would give additional powers and funding to Cornwall Council. The deal would give Cornwall Council more funding to invest in Cornwall's future, and more control over the decision-making that affects Cornwall's residents and businesses. The proposed deal could bring in £390m of extra funding to spend on homes, transport, our environment and protecting the Cornish language.

If Cornwall Council is to receive more powers and funding, it will need to change the way the council is governed, from the current system of a Council Leader, elected by the 87 Cornwall councillors every year, to a Mayor directly elected by the people of Cornwall every four years.

Cornwall Council want to know what people think about the proposed deal and required change in how the council is governed or led and will be holding public meetings in a number of places and will share details of the public events here.

Cornwall Council would also like the opportunity to visit people in their own 'place and space'. If you would be

The results of the consultation will be considered by Cornwall Council before any decision is made to proceed with the proposed deal, including making the required change to the council's governance to that of a directly elected Mayor.

CHURCH PLANTING THEOLOGY CONFERENCE 2023



The Centre for Church Planting Theology and Research is hosting 'A Theology of Planting?', the first academic conference that specifically addresses church planting and starting new churches to be held in the UK. The conference is being hosted by the Centre for Church Planting Theology and Research based at Cranmer Hall.

The conference will be held in person in Durham on March 20 - 22, 2023. The three days will be a mix of plenary sessions - including input from

missionary theologians Cathy Ross and Stefan Paas - and breakout sessions in which theologianpractitioners will be presenting papers. Alongside all this there will be plenty of time to network, share ideas, and enjoy Durham city and surroundings.

Their hope is that this conference will provide an ideal opportunity for theologians and practitioners to come together to reflect on the learnings from starting new churches.

CONTACTLESS GIVING

A Digital Rollout Programme is underway in the Church of England, and we are pleased to say that the Diocese of Truro has been successful in securing 50 contactless giving devices worth £23,000 at a significantly subsidised rate.

If you would like to be considered to receive one of these devices for your church you need to apply, and the application process will open on 23 January 2023. Training will be provided to the 50 churches selected to receive the devices. The devices will be delivered in May 2023.

Contactless giving has proved very successful in a number of churches around the diocese, enabling people to give to the church when they are carrying little or no cash. They are particularly useful for special events, coffee mornings, and occasional offices and for use by visitors to the church, bringing in significant extra funds



Please consider whether your church could benefit from one of these devices. Recent data suggests that most churches, large or small, would benefit.
