VITAL HELP AT HAND FOR CLERGY AND THEIR FAMILIES

Clergy Support Trust

A wide range of grants and services are available to Anglican clergy and their families from Clergy Support Trust.
Last year the charity helped more than 2,300 households, including more than 1 in 6 serving clergy in the Church of England.

The majority of the Trust's grants are made available for households which meet a simple savings and property threshold. Grants are available to help with emergencies or unexpected

expenses, including help with the cost-of-living crisis.

Clergy Support Trust also provides help with physical and mental health, including diagnostic tests, counselling and help with insomnia or poor sleep.

Mark described how he applied to the Trust: "I asked if they could help with a contribution towards a mobility scooter. An Occupational Therapist visited and advised me on my needs."

"The big difference the scooter has made is I can go to the beach or shopping and have fish and chips on the pier. All this would have been impossible before. To anyone considering approaching Clergy Support Trust I would simply say 'do it."

Clergy Support Trust, which is

independent from the Church, confidential and inclusive, can also fund holidays, retreats and respite breaks, fitness and leisure or sabbaticals.

The Revd Ben Cahill-Nicholls, Chief Executive of Clergy Support Trust: "At this challenging time we are helping more people than ever: ordinands with health needs and an e-book library, and our wider grants and services programme is supporting women and men at all stages of ministry, and those in retirement. "I encourage clergy and their families to get in touch. My team and I are honoured to be there for those whose days are filled supporting others."

This is the body that is responsible, on behalf of the Bishop's Diocesan Council, for overseeing the development, implementation and effectiveness of the Diocesan Environment Strategy including the ambition to achieve Net Zero by 2030. The Board is made up of representatives from key areas of the work involved in the strategy including diocesan properties, glebe, DAC, creation care and investment.

Until recently, the Revd Steve Morgan sat on the Board as a representative of

parishes and clergy and has been an important voice to help us ensure that the plans and their



implementation reflect the realities of parish life. Now Steve is moving on to a role outside the diocese, we would like to invite his fellow clergy to express their interest in sitting on the Board.

The Board meets on Zoom roughly every six weeks for 1.5 hours. There is

the option to also sit on the Creation Care Group, but this can be discussed, depending on your capacity.

An expression of interest needs to be no more than a paragraph about why you would be interested in joining the Board and if you have any particular experience or skills that would relate well to the work.

An Established Church in a Country of Nones. What are we to do?

Thursday 27 April, 3pm-4.30pm, online

Led by Canon Professor Mark Chapman

This session discusses the results of the recent census and the marked decline of people identifying with Christianity and the rise of those who claim to have no religion. Mark Chapman will look at the implications for mission as well as for the traditional 'established' model of the Church of England. Drawing on some of the recent parliamentary interventions during the debate around sexuality, he will raise some questions about whether it is better for the Church to be free from the links with the state or whether establishment is an idea that still has some mileage.

CORNWALL HISTORIC CHUCHES TRUST

Maintenance and Kickstart Scheme for 2023

All churches are facing immense challenges that have only increased since the Pandemic. General uncertainty is resulting in essential maintenance work being delayed and the shelving of much needed capital schemes

In order to encourage churches to act sooner rather than later, CHCT has set aside £10,000 for help with routine maintenance or start-up costs incurred putting together major projects. Grants of up to £500 are available on a first come, first served basis. The Scheme will close when the funds have been allocated or on December 31, 2023, whichever is sooner.

Maintenance Grants

CHCT is offering a one-off payment of £500 to cover the cost of inspection and clearance work as well as any remedial work that can be undertaken at the same time.

Kickstart Grants

Some churches wish to undertake major projects that require a considerable amount of work before the fund raising process can start. CHCT is offering a payment of $\mathfrak{L}500$ to help with project start-up costs such as surveys and feasibility studies.

However, the General Synod decided on February 8, 2023, to change the level of parochial fees with effect from March 1, 2023. These new fees are lower than the original 2023 fees.
