## Update on the Church of England's preparations for the Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort

Preparations for the Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort are now underway. The Coronation Service will take place at Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023 and will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most Rev'd Justin Welby.

- Following the recent announcements from Buckingham Palace, we are writing to you with an update on some of the planning that is being undertaken in the **Church of England**, and to give you information on the resources that you can expect to have available. Below is an outline of resources which are now available on the Church of England website: <u>The Coronation of King Charles III</u> <u>The Church of England</u> These resources are offered to support and encourage parishes and chaplaincies to engage with the celebrations surrounding the Coronation in the ways most appropriate for their local situation.
  - Liturgical resources, similar in variety to the types of resources distributed to support Operation London Bridge, and including:
  - Special forms of service (Holy Communion and a Service of the Word) for a civic or community gathering in honor of the Coronation. This will include complete orders for Holy Communion for a Special Communion (Common Worship Order One);
  - A Vigil Service for the day or evening before the Coronation;
  - An outline Order of Service for the weekend before the Coronation;
  - Prayers and forms of intercession for use at Morning and Evening Prayer including special sentences, a bidding prayer and responses. These could be used throughout the Coronation weekend, on the weekend before the

- Proper texts for use in a celebration of Holy Communion;
- Psalms, Readings and Prayers which can be incorporated into normal forms of service during, before, or after the Coronation. This will include for instance special prayers for use before a community screening of the Coronation.

## 2. 28 Days of Prayer

Material designed to be used in the 28 days of preparation, from Easter Sunday to the day of the Coronation. A **Book of Devotions** '*Daily Prayers for the Coronation of King Charles III*' is now available, including prayers and reflections for us to use when we pray with and for the King, as he prepares for the Coronation. The book offers for each day in the time between Easter Sunday (9<sup>th</sup> April) and the day of the Coronation (6<sup>th</sup> May) a daily theme, reading, reflection and prayer for use by individuals, families, churches, or groups.

This will also feature across the Church of England's Social Media content in the month leading up to the Coronation.

3. Led by the Church of England Vision and Strategy Team, a webinar, 'Celebrating the Coronation Weekend at your Church', will be taking place on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2023 at 11am. This will provide an opportunity to find out about resources, ideas and suggestions for planning locally, including educational, liturgical and publicity resources. org.zoom.us/webinar/register/WN\_KZqwP5psTJyy8bmRHAj0kw It is anticipated that the webinar will be recorded and made available in due course on the Church of England website.

- 4. **Collective worship resources for Primary and Secondary schools.** Available in a *Faith at Home* template (a weekly resource for schools), as well as PowerPoint presentations, and taking 6 elements of the Coronation Service as the structure for reflection on the Kingdom of God, including a prayer, a commitment and elements from the Commonwealth. Other resources for children and families will also be available.
- 5. A Digital Resource Hub, accessible from the Church of England's website, including links to digital resources and social media content can be found here: <u>The Coronation of King Charles III | The Church of England</u> This includes guidance on the content of the Coronation Service, helping to explain the symbolism of the service to a modern audience, as well as a publicity toolkit that churches and cathedrals can use to promote worship, community and volunteering events. These resources were launched on the Church of England's website and social media channels on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2023, with regular updates and additional content being shared in the weeks leading up to the Coronation Weekend.

- 6. In addition, this is also an opportunity to explore creative initiatives and ways in which to promote a legacy of engagement and new opportunities for young people and communities that extend far beyond the Coronation weekend.
- 7. As recently announced by **Buckingham Palace**, there will be a number of opportunities across the Coronation Weekend for people to come together to celebrate including:
- 'The Coronation Concert' at Windsor Castle on Sunday 7th May 2023;
- 'The Coronation Big Lunch' on Sunday 7th May 2023 where communities of all kinds, including churches, chaplaincies and cathedrals, are invited to run events to take part in the Coronation Big Lunch, sharing food and celebrating this historic occasion together. - 'The Big Help Out' on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2023. A day for volunteering and service to shine a light on the thousands of people volunteering each week, as well as presenting an opportunity to reach out and engage with new groups, communities and individuals to help fill volunteering opportunities. 8. BBC permissions for screening events of National Significance. It has been confirmed that the BBC will be waiving licensing requirements for public screenings of both the Coronation Service, and the Coronation Concert provided that tickets to public screenings are not sold and no profit is to be made from the screening. The BBC has produced guidance and as was the case with public screenings of the Platinum Jubilee Celebrations, and the State Funeral of Her Late Majesty The Queen, the broadcast would need to be screened live without interruption or edits. The terms and conditions will be the same as those for the Platinum Jubilee events and the funeral of HM Queen Elizabeth, which can be found here:

9. National Lottery Funding. Funding of up to £10,000 is available for events and activities surrounding the Coronation through the National Lottery 'Awards for All' programme. Community groups are encouraged to apply, and although there is no deadline for applications to the 'Awards for All' programme, it should be noted that it can take up to some weeks from the point of application submission to receiving funding if successful which means applications for the Coronation Weekend should be made as soon as possible.
