VULNERABILITY TO BURNOUT: HOW TO MEASURE IT AND HOW TO MINIMIZE IT

Thursday 27 February, 10.00-11.30am, online Led by the Revd Professor Andrew Village

This session introduces the Francis Burnout Inventory, a measure of clergy work-related psychological health. It is based on the notion of 'balanced affect', which suggests that emotional exhaustion in ministry can be partly offset by satisfaction in ministry. There will be a chance to help with the development of an online survey that aims to give clergy feedback on their vulnerability to burnout, and to talk about ways in which knowledge about who you are and what most exhausts or satisfies you can help to minimise your risk of burnout.

Andrew Village is a retired priest and professor emeritus at York St John University. Over the last two decades he has studied clergy and congregations, especially in the Church of England. His most recent study was the Church 2024 survey, which attracted responses from over 5000 clergy and churchgoers.

Jeremiah prophesied for forty years, and witnessed the destruction of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar's Babylonian army; everything he prophesied came true and still the people he was called to work among did not believe him. Jeremiah is the longest and, perhaps, the most passionate book in the Bible. Jeremiah was a man in violent struggle with his vocation to be a prophet. He wrote about God's sizzling anger and judgement and his everlasting love. We will spend this day reading and listening to some of what Jeremiah wrote and learning from him how to be more steadfast, ministering in uncertain times.

EXPORTING ANGLICANISM: MISSIONARY PROBLEMS AT HOME AND ABROAD

Led by Canon Professor Mark Chapman

Mark Chapman will explore some of the problems that emerged in the early years of the twentieth century in the mission field, with a focus on East Africa. He will focus on the great but intransigent Anglo-Catholic Bishop of Zanzibar Frank Weston and how he found himself in conflict with more evangelical expressions of Anglicanism. This session will look at how these old disputes continue to affect the Anglican Communion and even the Church of England.

Mark David Chapman is a British Anglican priest, theologian, historian, and academic. He was Vice-Principal of Ripon College Cuddesdon from 2002-2024, and has been Full Professor of the History of Modern Theology at the University of Oxford since 2015. Mark is Canon Theologian at Truro Cathedral.
