SENS KERNEWEK 2024

We are currently inviting applications for the next cohort of Sens Kernewek, beginning at the end of April.

In the spirit of 'The Saints Way', Sens Kernewek is designed to be an innovative, communal learning experience, to 'equip the saints for the work of ministry' here in Cornwall with a clear focus on training people for local church leadership. Those who take part in Sens Kernewek will be equipped to lead an individual church as part of collaborative clusters or groups. They will be responsible for leading the faithful in mission, worship and service within a specific local community, under the oversight of an incumbent or parish priest.

The sessions are based on the description of the very earliest church in Acts 2:42, who 'devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer'.

Sens Kernewek meetings take place approximately once a fortnight on week night evenings for a total of 14 sessions. The programme focuses on learning scripturally and theologically from our lived experience, sharing together in Bible study and prayer.

Three Mornings with St Paul Part 3: Christian community, then and now

Artificial Intelligence and the Church

In an era when technology permeates every aspect of life, the Anglican church stands at a crossroad, contemplating the role of artificial intelligence within its ministry. The Revd Mark James is hosting an explorative workshop designed to delve into the potential harmonies and dissonances between AI applications and the values we are to uphold. The workshop invites participants to engage in a thought-provoking dialogue addressing critical questions such as: The Role of AI: How can artificial intelligence complement the mission of the church while staying true to our core values and beliefs?

Resilience Training

Wednesday 12 June 2.00pm-4.00pm, Epiphany House

Resilience is defined as "the capacity to recover quickly from difficulties". We all face challenges and difficulties throughout our lives and learning to cope with, and recover from them, is a useful skill to develop.

Led by Sally Piper and Jane Vaughan-Wilson, this CMD session will explore, through interactive exercises, small group discussion and case studies, how we can grow in our personal resilience. The session will cover how to work with challenging behaviour and conflict, how we respond and react, what we might say or do and what support we may need.

There will be time to share and discuss real examples and draw on the wisdom of the group.

Six Hours with Twelve Prophets

At the end of the (English) Old Testament are twelve prophetic books, commonly called "The Minor Prophets", mainly because they are shorter in length than the "major" prophets.

In this workshop/retreat we will "helicopter" over these twelve books (were they ever intended as one book?), observing their main themes and reflecting on their relevance for our lives and work today.

Come and explore how to reach people in new and fresh ways. In Trelawny Benefice they hold services in farmyards, village greens and quay sides. Like the monks of old who first visited Cornwall they meet people where they are at in their natural environment.

Come and see how to conduct a variety of different inspirational services ranging from Tractor Services, Lambing and Calving services, Harvest Festival on the farm and Harvest of the Sea on the quayside to traditional farming services of Plough and Rogation as well as special services for holiday makers called Church on the Quay.
