BISHOP DAVID'S WELCOME SERVICE THIS MONTH

The next Bishop of Truro, David Williams, will be installed at a service of welcome at Truro Cathedral on Saturday, May 17, 2025 at 11am.

Cornish welcome to the new bishop, his wife, Helen and their family as we adventure together to discover the goodness of God and faithfully learn how to live in God's light.

BESPOKE TRAINING CREATED FOR LOCAL PASTORAL MINISTERS

To support the great work of Local Pastoral Ministers (LPMs) and recognising their unique role in the church, we are pleased to offer "bespoke to role" safeguarding training in conjunction with the ministry team, the first bespoke to role module produced within the diocese.

This new training, which has been created by Safeguarding Trainer Mandy Wells and Sarah Welply, Lay Ministry Development Officer, will form part of the initial and repeat training that LPMs complete.

The new programme will be rolled out to those not in date with their safeguarding training and will then be part of the normal pattern as people renew training.

Mandy said: "The LPMs will still follow the national safeguarding training but this new module will allow emphasis on best practice unique to their role. We believe that having the opportunity to hold conversations directly relating to their role will strengthen their understanding of safeguarding, lone working guidance; the importance of supervision; and recognising where there are concerns that they are reported early on."

Sarah added: "It has been great to work with Mandy to develop this training for our Local Pastoral Ministers. Having safeguarding training tailored to their role which explores some of the situations that they might encounter is a great opportunity to boost their confidence when out and about."

KEY FINDINGS INTO CORKER MEMORIAL PRESENTED

The key findings from a Heritage Impact Report into the memorial of Thomas Corker in King Charles the Martyr Church, Falmouth, were presented to stakeholders in April.

During the meeting, report author Dr Alice Kinghorn, who has worked with the Church of England and other dioceses with contested heritage, offered her recommendations for the most appropriate outcome regarding relocation of the memorial and discussed the impact of the proposed move as well as outlining and sharing her evaluation of all the other options that have been considered for the memorial. Her recommendations are based on the Church of England's Contested Heritage Guidance and have drawn on examples from other churches around the country.

The findings of this report will support a faculty application by the church for the relocation of the Corker memorial.

Dr Kinghorn was commissioned to the prepare the report on behalf of King Charles the Martyr Church Parochial Church Council. The paper not only covers the historical, artistic, architectural, and social context of the Corker memorial within the church itself, the town of Falmouth, and its connection with African chattel enslavement; it



also includes further research into other memorials within the church with contested histories.

This presentation was an opportunity for feedback, engagement and questions and to learn about the history of the memorial, including precedent for monument relocation, the impact of the memorial on the church's mission as a space of worship, and the considerations necessary for the next recommended steps.

VE DAY RESOURCES FOR CHURCHES

Churches preparing to participate in commemorations to mark the 80th anniversary of Victory in Europe (VE) Day on Thursday, May 8, 2025 can access resources on the Church of England website and on the government's website.

Events will offer an opportunity for reflection, remembrance, and a renewed commitment to peace, echoing the spirit of unity that defined the end of the Second World War in Europe.

On the day, communities will come together to honour the sacrifices made by those who served in the conflict and to pray for lasting peace both at home and abroad. The Church of England is providing resources and encouraging parishes to engage in acts of commemoration and prayer.

A key element of the commemoration will be the ringing of church bells at 6.30pm on VE Day. Echoing the sounds that swept across the country in 1945, churches and cathedrals are invited to ring their bells as a collective act of thanksgiving.

Parishes are also encouraged to hold **services** to commemorate the anniversary. Worship resources are also available to assist clergy and lay leaders in planning these acts of worship, providing a framework for remembrance, reflection, and prayer.

Individuals will also have the opportunity to light a **virtual candle** online to honour loved ones who were part of the war effort. The Bishop of St Germans, Hugh Nelson,

the lead Bishop for the Armed Forces, said: "The 80th anniversary of VE Day is a moment of profound significance for our nation. It is a time to remember with deep gratitude the courage and sacrifice of those who fought for the freedoms we enjoy today.

"In an increasingly dangerous world, I encourage all our churches to participate in these commemorations, to ring their bells, to offer prayers for peace, and to provide spaces for their communities to come together in remembrance. As we honour the past, so we renew our commitment to building a more peaceful and just world for all."
