REVISED CLERGY HANDBOOK

The clergy handbook has recently been updated and now includes:

- · a new section on safeguarding
- an increase in time off for partners to attend ante-natal care appointments
- an increase in paid paternity leave from 2 to 4 weeks
- a new fostering policy
- new wording on our expectation of rest days (anticipating forthcoming legislative changes following General Synod agreement on this) and weekly working hours (to reflect existing practice and

- messaging)
- new section on bereavement and compassionate leave including introduction of paid parental bereavement leave
- new menopause policy
- new death in service (i.e. in office) policy, formalising current practice and increased benefits
- inclusion of our clergy housing policy and special agreements policy

SICK LEAVE

A reminder that if you take any days off sick, do please fill out the self-certificate sick leave form (for absences of 7 days or less) and send to your Archdeacon and HR (Louise Court). If you are off for more than 7 days you will need to get a fit note from your GP or hospital.

This is not bureaucracy but part of supporting your health and wellbeing, and that of all our clergy, so please help us to help you. We also need the information for the clergy payroll team's records.

If you are not well enough to work, for whatever reason, please don't!

CLERGY PENSION

If you are in a stipendiary role you will hopefully be aware that Synod met last July, and agreed a number of significant improvements to the Church of England Funded Pension Scheme for the Clergy in line with a proposal from the Archbishops' Council. Many thousands of members will see their pensions improved but it will take time to do that. The first step is for Synod to agree the necessary amendments to the CEFPS Rules in February. The changes will then be implemented in stages, and it may take over a year. In the meantime the CofE Pension Team have put together a live Q&A for members here which they will update as progress is made.

FRAUDULENT TEXT MESSAGES

Church of England Central Services have received reports of fraudulent text messages being sent to clergy claiming that they must submit their HLC return online or their stipend will be stopped. Please be aware:

- They do not send text messages regarding HLC returns or stipend payments.
- Clergy must not click on any links sent via text message purporting to be from People System Support.
- Clergy should always log in directly to their People System account.

If you think you've received such a text message please report it to the **central team**

MESSY CHURCH GRANT

The Church of England is offering a support package to CofE Churches in areas of deprivation wanting to start a new Messy Church. Microgrants of £250 are available to purchase resources for your new Messy Church, a bundle of Messy Church books worth over £50, training and ongoing support in the form of an online learning community of Messy Church leaders ministering in areas of deprivation.

If you are unsure whether your church is in an area of deprivation, there is a really helpful lookup tool on the Church Urban Fund **webpage here**. To qualify for a Messy Microgrant your church needs to be in the 25% most deprived parishes in the country.
