THE DIOCESAN TEAM

This paper points to some of the ways that your diocesan team at the Old Cathedral School supports the work of the church in Cornwall, the Isles of Scilly, and the two best parishes in Devon.

The team support more than 300 churches, 200 PCCs, more than 250 clergy, with nearly 100 readers, and well over 200 local worship leaders and local pastoral ministers. The Diocesan Board of Finance is the charity that employs the team here as well as providing core diocesan governance and leadership capacity.

We want you to know what we are up to, what we are prioritising, and putting it bluntly because PCCs are asked to pay for some of this work we want you to know where your money goes.

Our operational priority in 2025 has continued to be supporting stipendiary clergy, you can see this through our budget (our biggest budget lines are for clergy stipends and clergy housing) and through our work to move quickly on clergy vacancies.

Safeguarding informs all our work and is one of the areas where workload has increased most, we don't think the increase is because there is more wickedness, but because people know how to report, because we are less tolerant of bad behaviour, and because increasingly victims and survivors trust the church as somewhere that leaders will have been trained and where

they will be supported. I want to pay tribute to parish clergy and parish safeguarding officers – you are where we make the difference in safeguarding.

Bishop David has re-committed the diocese to the work of Change and Renewal, there is a small team here to support that but the real work again has to happen in parishes and deaneries as you respond to the changing need of Cornwall through faithful service.

This is where your MMF goes, to provide clergy and to support our life as a diocese. In this diocese as in others there is a three-way partnership of funding; local funding through MMF, diocesan through DBF resources, and national funding, mostly Lowest Income Communities Funding (LICF) – in this diocese the proportion that comes from parishes is relatively small but that three-way partnership is still crucial.

I am proud to be part of the team here, and to be part of the Diocese of Truro family, I am grateful to God for you all and for your generous faithfulness from the furthest flung cathedral to the tiny church at the heart of its community.

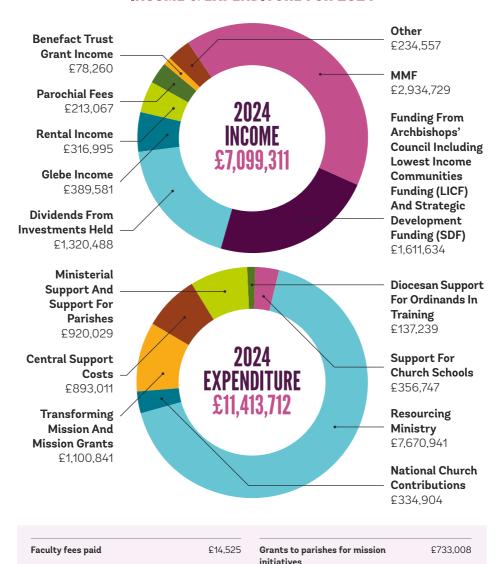
