Advent Adventures

A project allowing schools to work in partnership with their local churches in learning about the Christmas story and how Christians prepare for Christmas.



Advent Wreath

Craft Activity

You will need:

- Green and red paper, holly leaves already cut out, Pencils/pens
- Glue sticks
- Scissors
- Felt Pens
- Paper plates
- Advent wreath to show as an example
- words written out for children to copy (love, joy, peace, hope, Jesus) or print out the words (7)

Show children what they are making. Explain 5 candles (in church we light one for each week in Advent and one for Jesus on Christmas day). Explain how to do it.

- 1. Stick holly onto paper plate
- 2. Cut out candles and colour them in.
- 3. Write or stick on 5 words to candles
- 4. Colour flames
- 5. Assemble the wreath.





Handy Christmas Tree

Craft Activity

Make a Christmas tree on which to stick your prayer baubles or stars:

- Draw around your hand onto a piece of green paper
- Cut out the shape you have made
- Stick the shapes onto a large sheet of card in a triangle shape with fingers pointing down
- Stick only the palms of the hands allowing the fingers to curl slightly.
- Add a cut out trunk or pot.





Prayer Decoration



You will need:

- Cut outs of baubles in different shapes (stars work well for this too)
- Pencils/pens
- Glue sticks
- Sequins, stickers of pieces of coloured paper/foil to add decorations
- Biodegradable glitter (if you are feeling brave!)

Ask children to write a prayer for Christmas onto the shape – talk about this and encourage ideas such as peace, time with family, the special gift of the child Jesus rather than a list of things you would like for Christmas.



Make Props for the Drama



Make a headband to use as part of the drama activity. This could be turned into:

- An animal (camel/donkey/sheep) by adding ears/ coloured paper/tissue
- A shepherd's headband by colouring with stripes or spots (tea towels optional!)
- A king's crown by adding shiny/sparkly paper
- An angel's halo by adding tinsel/tin foil

If you choose this activity, the drama would need to be done at the end of the session with all children participating at the same time.



Make a Christmas Card



You will need:

- Black or dark blue card or stiff paper, ready folded is usually easier
- Star template
- Silver or white paper
- Stick on stars
- Squares of paper to write on
- 1. Use a template to cut a large star and stick it in the middle of the card
- 2. Surround it with small stick on stars
- 3. Write a message such as "Christmas Blessings" or "Follow the Star" or just "Merry Christmas" on the square of paper
- 4. Write who the card is to and from
- 5. Stick the message in the card



Make a Paper Plate Angel



Use a paper plate to create an angel

- Cut out an angel shape from a paper plate (Click on the picture below for a good template)
- Write or stick on the phrase "Do not be afraid, I bring tidings of great joy"
- Talk about what is joyful about the birth of Jesus
- Decorate your angel





Make a Wax Candle



You will need:

- A white votive candle
- Coloured wax craft strips (see link below)
- 1. Discuss which colour you feel best matches love, joy, hope, peace and Jesus.
- 2. Wind the wax strips around the candle to make five stripes
- Take the candle hope to burn a layer on each Sunday of Advent and on Christmas Day.





Make a Stained Glass Candle



You will need:

- A piece of black sugar paper
- Coloured tissue paper
- Scissors
- A glue stick
- Cut out a candle shape from the black paper – be careful you will be using the sheet with the hole in, not the cut-out candle itself
- 2. Cut or tear tissue paper into strips or shapes
- 3. Stick the tissue pieces over the hole to create a stained-glass window in the shape of a candle



Act Out the Story

Drama Activity

You will need:

- Gold, frankincense and myrrh
- 3 crowns
- 3 robes
- 3 stars
- Manger and doll
- Joseph and Mary
- Angel halo
- Script for Wise Men Drama (6)
- 1. Explain we are going to act the bit about the wise men. Adult retells the story (see script) and children act it out. Turn this into a mini pilgrimage round the church look for the 3 stars and find 3 gifts.
- 2. Use the script from Carnmarth South Deanery (6)



Retell the Story (Godly Play)



If you have a <u>Godly Play</u> practitioner in your congregation, this is a wonderful way to help the children get inside the Christmas story.

You will need:

- Wooden nativity set
- Bag of sand
- Godly Play script (8)

Sit in a circle on rug. Explain we are going to listen again and do some wondering about the story. Imagine you were there.

I wonder what Mary thought? I wonder which bit of the story you liked the best. I wonder what it was like to be there? I wonder what it would have smelt like in the stable. I wonder what it would have sounded like ... I wonder if you could hear the angels singing ... I wonder

what the wise men said to each other as they walked home...
