We've had great support from the Diocese of Truro throughout our fundraising journey. Early on, I spoke to one of the Generous Giving Advisors, Christine Salaman, who was wonderful at offering advice on how best to use our SumUp card machines and a great contact whenever I had a query.

Our church is large and, like many others, expensive to heat. The money we've raised, along with the match funding, will go towards installing new infrared Halo Heaters. These chandelier-style heaters warm people rather than the building, making them efficient and environmentally friendly.
